


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What is distinctive for Dutch nature?







Four types of quality teams (always different disciplines as members)

- . Initiating team: formulate and sharpen the assignment, set spatial quality rules and advise on tender content (barrier dam Afsluitdijk)
- . Developing team: help develop a site or a project, closely linked with the municipality/province in charge. Defining a set of rules and regulations to transform areas within their specific atmosphere (world heritage Beemster)
- . Accompanying team: works together during the development, a bit less powerful in mandate but adding huge value (New Dutch Waterline, future world heritage?)
- . Classical beauty committee: on buildings, operating with a set of rules and regulations established by local government (most municipalities in the Netherlands)
